**Visual Information** 

We always get information visual and we trust visual information – we privilege it, "eyewitness"

Silent film (explain Napoleon, England, and our own war of 1812) Nonlinear – a lot of information can be conveyed <u>very</u> quickly & efficiently <u>Slide show</u>

What information do we get? 1<sup>st</sup> clip from Richard III

Efficiency in nonlinear forms!

Think of things you can portray visually - nonverbally

Visual information vs. iconography A maker decides what information to <u>show</u> rather than tell Showing can be: more <u>effective</u>, more powerful, faster

Why not? Why use verbal information?

Certain complexities can be misconstrued, but than can be minimized Silent film Can become so involved in story that you accept limitations of the medium
