- I finished my secondary school 1998 in Kilimanjaro region.
- Trained as motor vehicle mechanics' for 8 months.

MY DISABILITY

- 2nd January 2000 I got my disability.
- 5th January 2000 admitted at KCMC Hospital for rehabilitation services.
- Diagnosed spinal injured at lumber 1 incomplete.
- Stayed in the hospital for eight months
- I got discharged in 16th august 2000

SITUATION OF PEOPLE WITH DISABILITIES IN TANZANIA.

- The August 2002 Population and housing censes carried a question on disability.
- Official result are not yet known.
- According to WHO formula of 1 in 10 being person with disabilities.
- Tanzania with Population (2002) of 34,569,232
- Tanzania estimated to have 3,346,900 people with disabilities.
