Agreement gambits:

I couldn't have said it better myself.

Disagreement gambits:

I don't quite agree.

I don't see it that way.

That's not how I see it.

I would disagree with that.

I couldn't disagree with you more.

I see your point, but . . .

I understand how you might see it that way, but . . .
