- 4. Ask your friend if he cooks often.
- 5. Ask your American colleague what he thinks of Japanese foods.
- 6. Tell your colleague that Keiko's room is always clean, but that she told you that she doesn't clean her room everyday.
- 7. Tell your colleague that you think that Japanese is not difficult, but that Mary thinks that it is difficult.
- 8. You saw your neighbor is wondering about today's weather. Tell her that it will not rain today, according to the weather forecast.
- 9. Ask your friend if she has a test in political science class tomorrow.
- 10. Tell your friend that you like cooking, but you are not good at it.
- 11. Ask your colleague if he will bring something to Keiko's birthday party.
- 12. Tell your colleague that you didn't do anything yesterday, so it was very boring.
- 13. You don't want your colleague to call you late at night. Ask her not to call you late at night.
- 14. You heard that some people at work went to New York by car this weekend. Find out who drove the car.
- 15. You were invited to a barbecue party at your friend's house. You heard that one of your friends would not be able to come because he has a part-time job. Express your disappointment.
- 16. Your colleague, Keiko, thinks that Mary speaks Japanese very well. Agree with Keiko.
- 17. Your colleague asked you about another colleague Kimura. Tell your colleague that Kimura had told you that she often goes swimming at the pool because she likes swimming.
- 18. Your classmate is taking five classes. Ask which class is interesting.
- 19. You heard that your neighbor likes playing tennis. Tell him that you are bad at playing tennis, but you like it. Invite him to play on Sunday.
- 20. Tell your friend that you don't like to go see a movie alone.
