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Questions on Selenocysteine papers Allemand et. al.

1. Based on the information given in the figure legend for Figure 2 of Allemand et. al., explain why the rigid spinal muscular dystrophy patient whose protein extract is run in lane 5 of Figure 2 shows very little reactivity to the anti selN antibody at the 70kd position compared to a normal control.

2. Based on the information given in the figure legend for Figure 2 of Allemand et. al., explain why the rigid spinal muscular dystrophy patient whose protein extract is run in lane 3 of Figure 2 shows a similar level of reactivity to the anti selN antibody at the 70kd position compared to a normal control yet still has rigid spinal muscular dystrophy.

3. What would you expect the clinical phenotype of their children to be if the propositus in Allemand et. al. (Patient II-2) had married the patient whose protein extract is shown in Lane 8 of Figure 2. Explain your answer.
