

## Using PokerTracker for Poker Analysis

PokerTracker is the industry leading analysis and tracking software for online poker players since 2001.

PokerTracker helps players to identify and analyze similar *Decision Points* to improve their game.



### What is a Decision Point?

- A Decision Point is any time in a hand that you as a player can check, bet, call, raise or fold.
- Poker players naturally remember similar Decision Points
- Using PokerTracker to analyze interesting Decision Points is an effective way to start improving your game.



### What Makes a Decision Point Interesting?

- A Decision Point is interesting when the expectation of the different options is not clear *to you*.
- Different levels of players will find different decisions interesting.

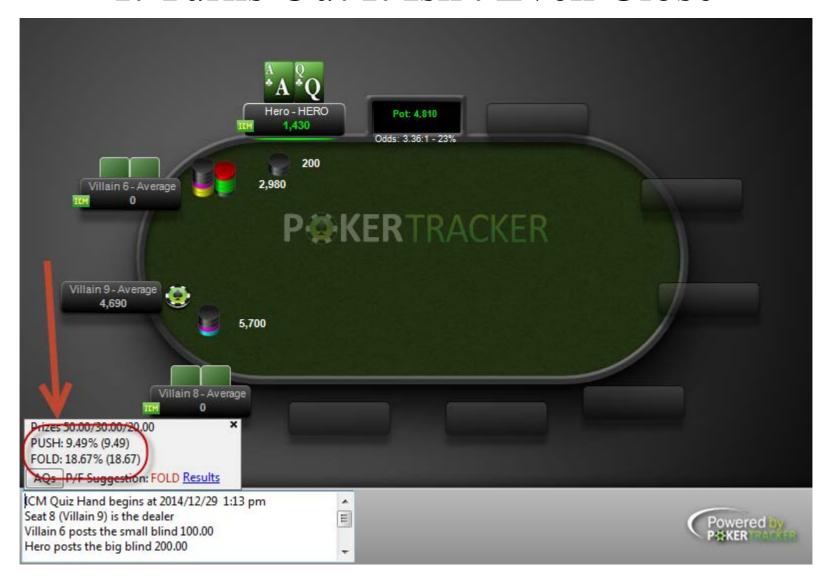


Here is a Decision Point on the bubble in a 50/30/20 Payout Single Table SnG



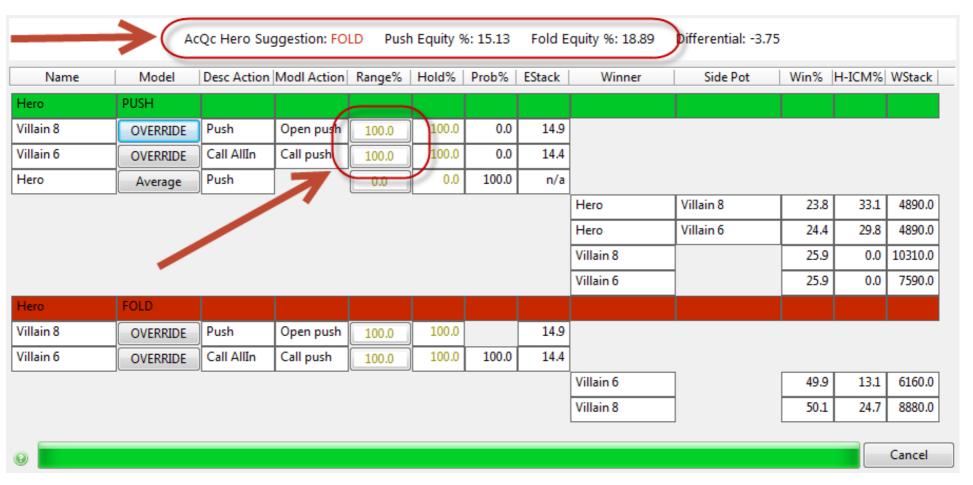

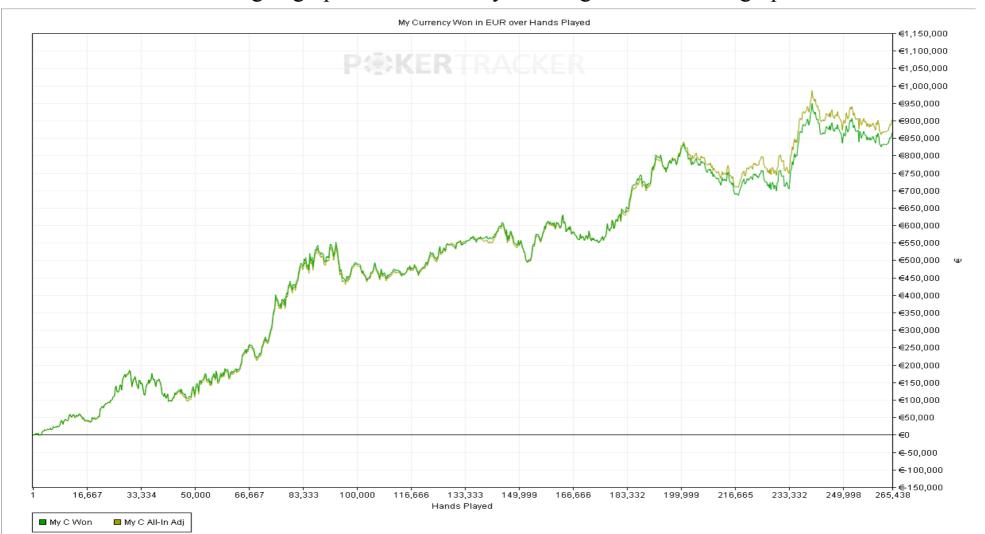

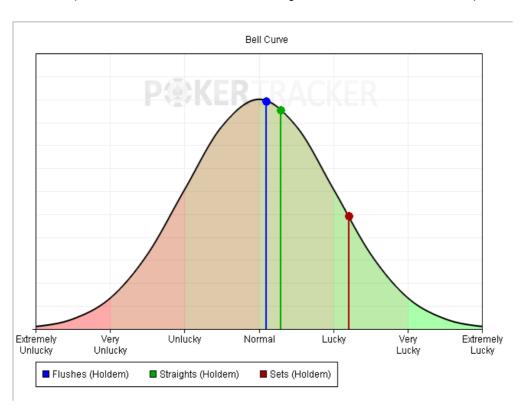

## How Do You Get Better at Poker Using PokerTracker 4?

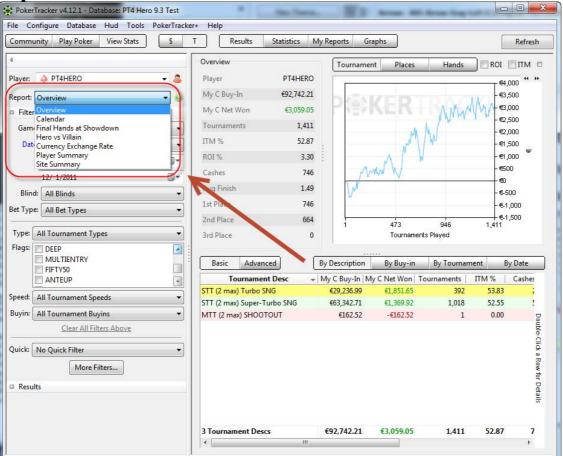
- 1) Use PokerTracker 4's reports and filters to look at specific kinds of decision points.
- 2) Create mental models of the players in the specific situation.
- 3) Adjust those models based on any relevant statistics, notes or other information you may have.
- 4) Evaluate the different decision options and their relative merits.
- 5) Go to step 1.



## **Basic Report Navigation**

Reports are accessed on the View Stats page.

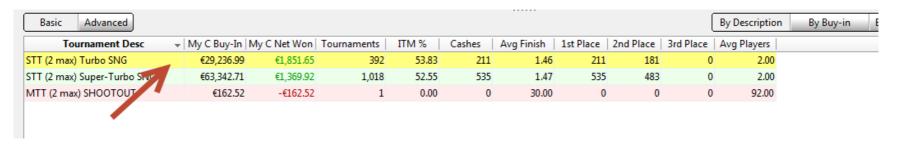
Individual reports can be chosen in the sidebar.

Many reports allow you to double click to get more detailed information on that row.

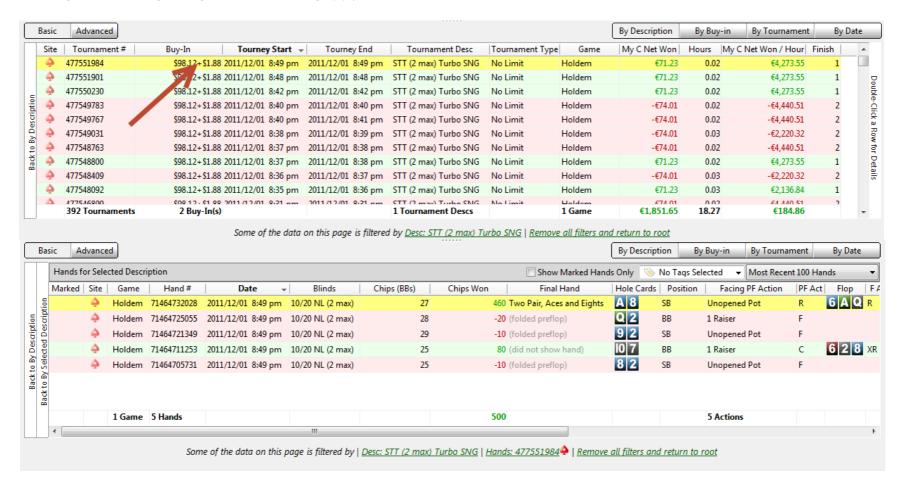

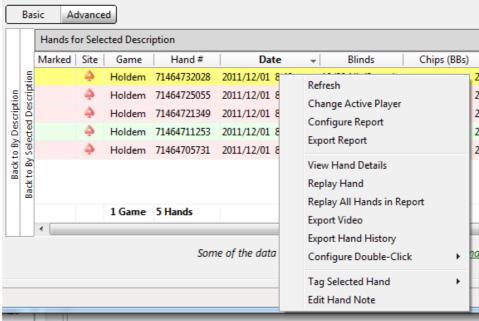




## Right Clicking

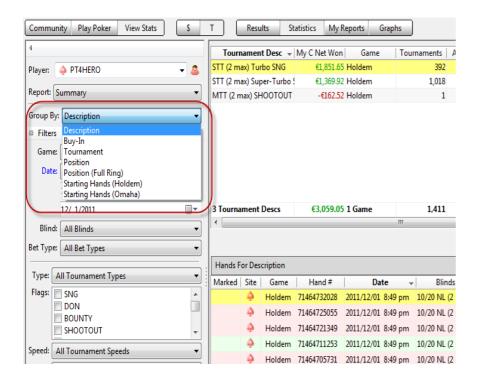
All reports have a right click context menu. You can use this menu to configure the report to add or remove statistics, replay hands, export them, add notes, and more.

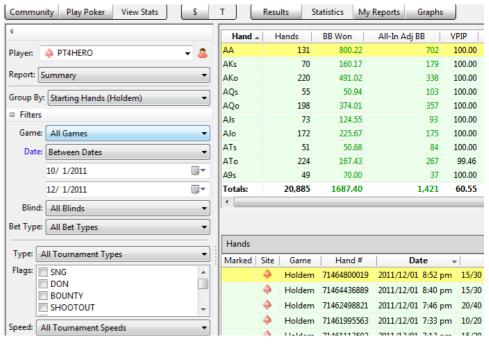
You can use shift or ctrl + click to select multiple rows.





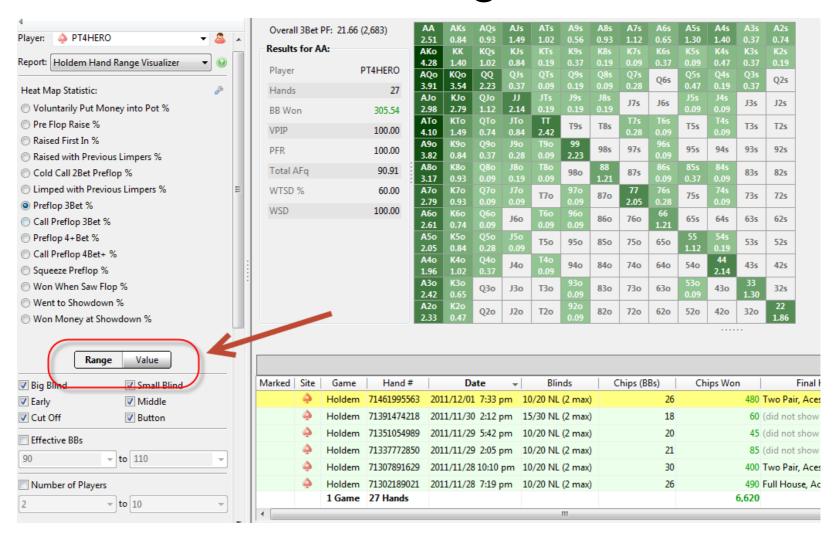

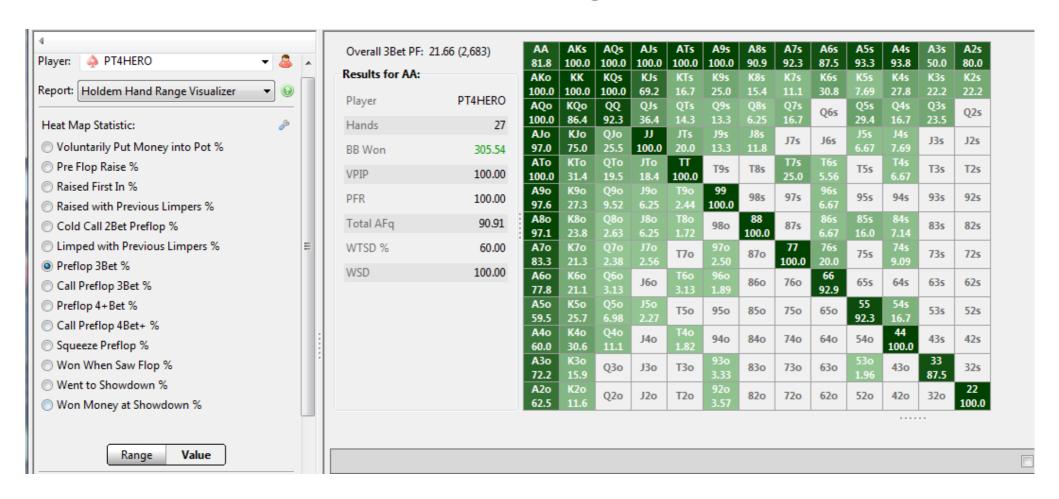

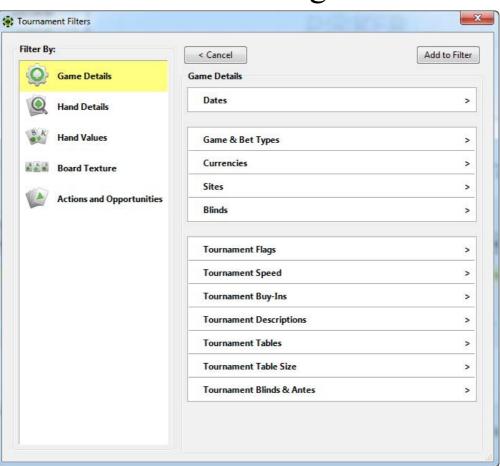

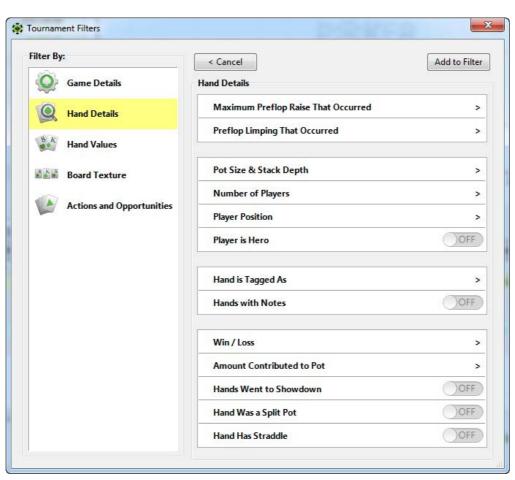
## How to Navigate the Filters

- Choose a section to see its filters.

- Anytime you go down a level, the button above the filters with the "<" takes you up one level.
- When you have all filters you want turned on, click Add to Filter





Use this filter section for filters about the hand as a whole







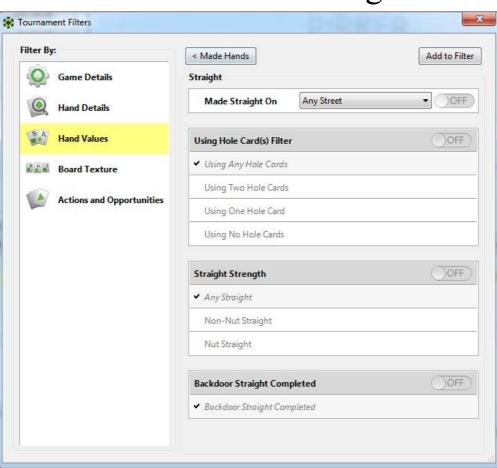

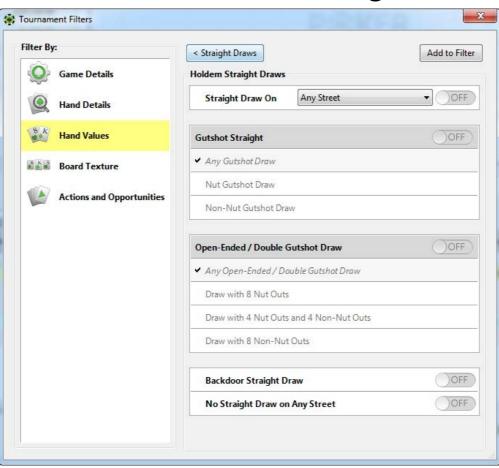

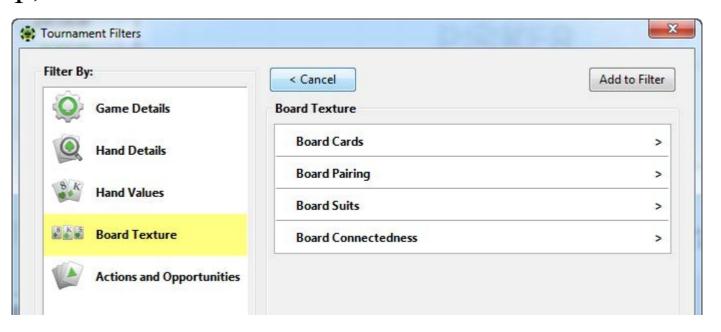

Use this filter section to filter based on the cards that came out on the flop, turn or river.

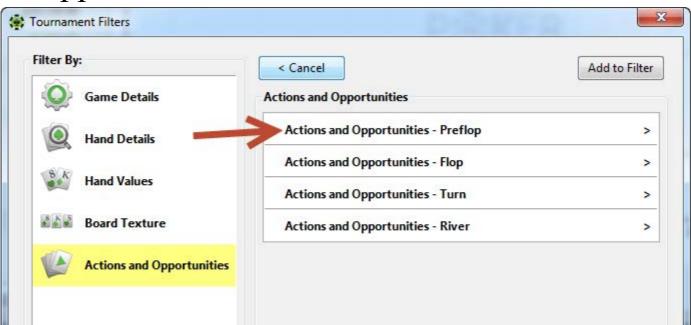




## Actions & Opportunities

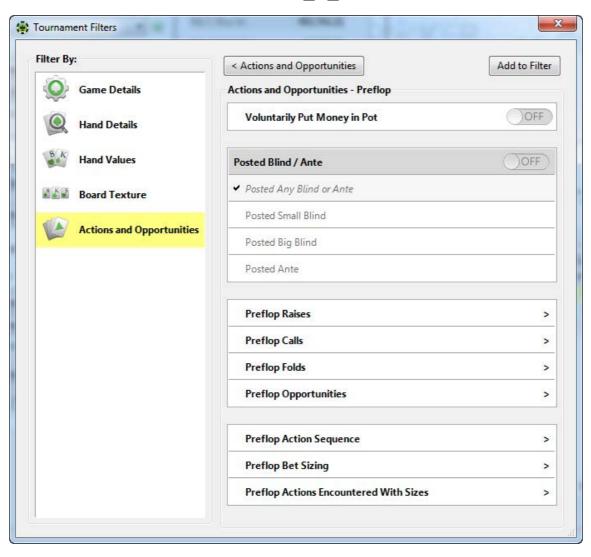
Use this filter section to filter for specific actions the Active Player took, or opportunities the Active Player had.

This includes bets (and sizing), raises faced (and sizing), calls, folds and opportunities of all kinds.









#### So . . . What Are the Stats?

- Most stats tell you how often a player took a specific action in a specific situation.
- These kinds of stats display as a percentage:
  - (# of Times / # of Opportunities) \* 100



#### Examples

- VPIP: Percentage of the time a player voluntarily put money in the pot preflop
- Raise First In: Percentage of the time a player raises on their first action preflop when it is folded to them
- Some can be very specific Fold to Raise After F CBet in 3Bet+ Pot



#### Use the Results → Player Summary Report


 You can sort by clicking column headers to find your most common opponents and add more stats as needed.





## Want To Go Deeper?


The Hero vs Villain report loads hands you played with individual villains for easy searching.

Load the Villain in the Player drop down and you can view any report in PT4 from his perspective.

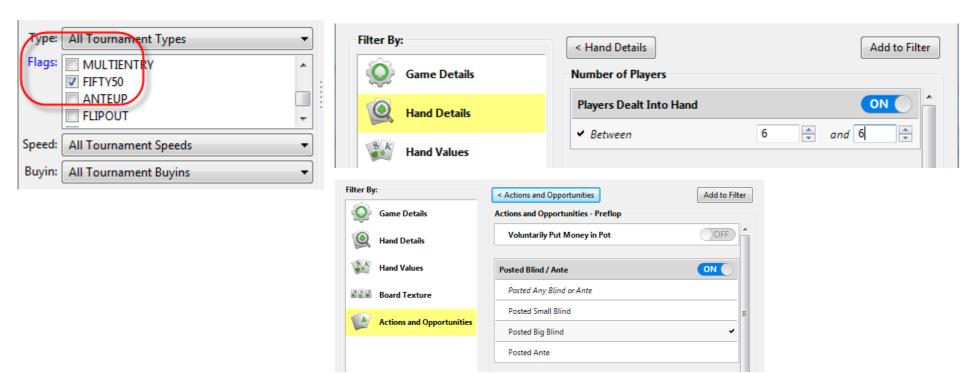




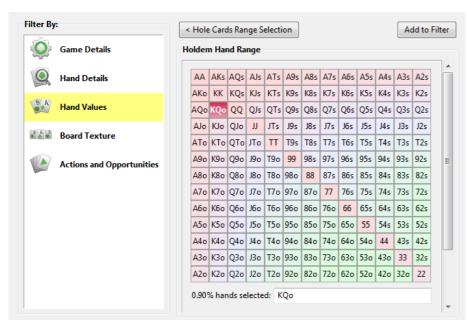
#### Analysis In Action

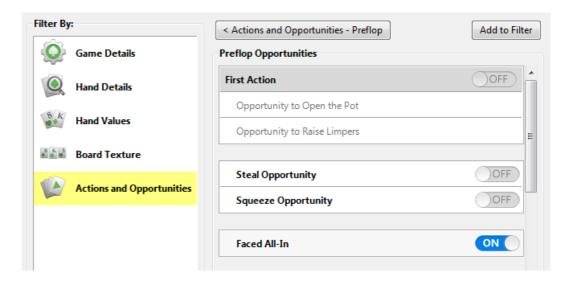
Say we want to examine our Big Blind play, 6 handed in a Fifty50 Tournament with KQo facing an open shove.


- A Fifty50 tournament pays the top 5 entrants (of 10) back their buy in cost, and the rest of the prize pool is distributed according to chip stack.








  - We need a default model before we can adjust!





# Now Let's Add Stats And Refine Our Model of Villain 18

In 73 hands, Villain 18 has played 11% of hands, raising only once.

- His tournament life is on the line.
- He's the short stack, with an M of about 2.7.

• Does he play low pocket pairs?

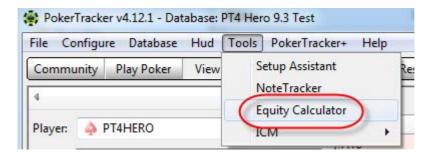
- What about weak aces?

## TIP: Use the PT4 Equity Calculator

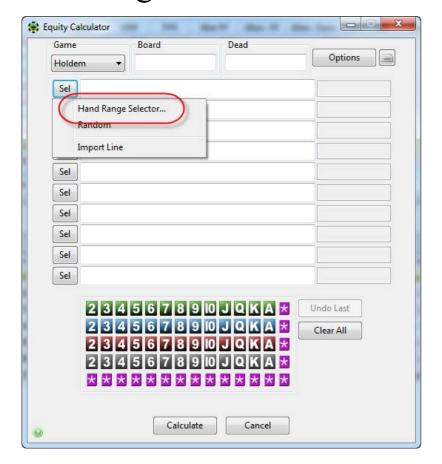
PT4 has a built in Equity Calculator that can help you convert from actual ranges to percentages of all hands.

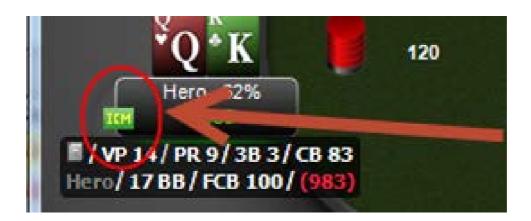

- This will show the results using the default Average model.





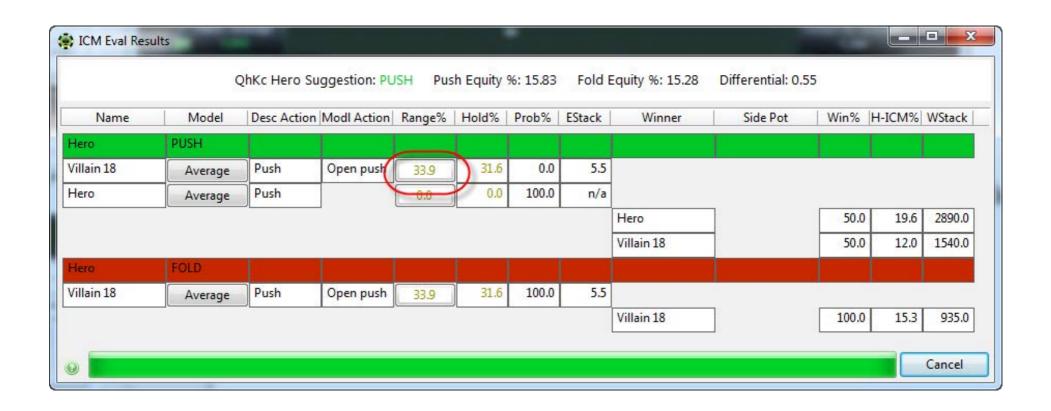
## The Default Model Says Push!

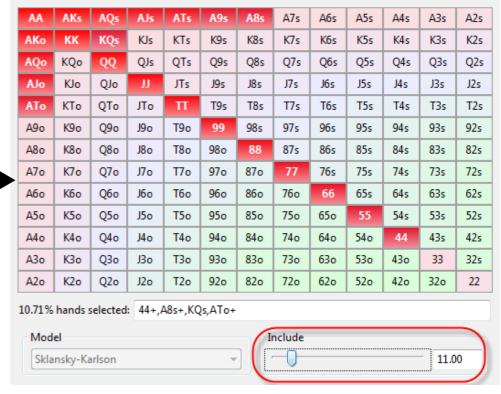

#### Lessons

- Think about poker as a series of discrete Decision Points.
- Use Filters to target very specific Decision Points.
- Use available information to build a mental model of your opponents.
- Analyze your options based on your hand and your mental model.
- When your mental model is proven wrong (and it will be), adjust it.
